Intro

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The more common definitions of excellence such as fineness, superiority, brilliance leads us into thinking of it as a skill, an add-on or a gift. I am here to tell you today that excellence is first and foremost a choice. According to Aristotle the great Greek philosopher, 'we are what we repeatedly do; excellence therefore is not an act but a habit. Ralph Marston, an American professional football player in the nineteen twenties defines excellence as an attitude.

Permit me to give you a working definition of excellence – **excellence is the** full and continuous comprehension of the highest demands of a role, office, duty, task, occupation or service and the willingness to do all that is required to fully meet those demands no matter the circumstance.

We need a re-orientation, a reformatting so to speak of our minds. Our mind need to undergo a cleansing from the wrong standards, wrong practices, incorrect information, wrong procedures. 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Mentally, we must switch gears; standards considered acceptable under the old order must give way to the new order – the order of excellence.

This change must come from within and can be achieved by the application of what I have termed the **5D principle**; **Desire, Decision, Determination, Diligence and Dedication.**

50 Principle

Desire Decision Determination Diligence Dedication We must start with a desire, a fervent aspiration to change the old standard of mediocrity, sloppiness, fulfilling the basics, selfish ambition, greed, blame sharing, apathy, cutting corners, "make we manage am" etc in order to achieve all round excellence. Desire can be likened to the foundation upon which a house is built.

D₁ Desire

A fervent aspiration to change the old standard of mediocrity, sloppiness, fulfilling the basics, selfish ambition, greed, blamesharing and apathy in order to achieve all-round excellence My desire will inform my decision.

I cannot make a decision about that which I have not first desired. Decision concretises my desire and leads me to take proactive steps towards achieving that desire.

D₂ Decision

Decision concretizes my desire and leads me to take proactive steps towards achieving that desire.

The next step in this process is Determination also known as strength of mind.

There is a threshold we must get to in our minds, a point at which retreat is no longer an option.

This ensures we do not quit when the going gets tough. Determination backs decision and gives the impetus to keep on.

Determination

Also known as 'strength of mind', it is a threshold we must get to in our minds, a point at which retreat is no longer an option. No quitting when the going gets tough. Dedication is an allegiance to a person or a cause.

Our cause is excellence. Dearly beloved students on the advent of your induction you will be required to take the Hippocratic Oath – (the code of ethics of the medical profession) you must be ready for a lifelong dedication to the dictates of this Oath.

You must accept the standard of excellence as the norm, replacing **the current shoddy practices of overcharging, deliberate and harmful substituting of placebos for medicine, putting pecuniary consideration above patient interest, violation of the patient confidentiality rule.** Excellence must become the only acceptable way and manner of living, conducting business, rendering a service or discharging the duties of office. An allegiance to a person or a cause. Our cause is excellence. In practice, you must be ready for a lifelong dedication to the dictates of the Hippocratic Oath.

D₄ Dedication

Diligence - the next principle is crucial. In practical terms diligence is the application of constant, concentrated and well directed effort. Physicists define effort as work; there is work to be done to attain excellence. It does not fall like the proverbial ripe cherries.

Diligence keeps the entire machinery running and takes us from one level to another. It takes us from stunted growth to large growth and takes us to greatness.

I request your permission to take you on a brief course of Jewish history.

1. Taken captive from his native land and brought to the land of Babylon as a young man, he passed the king of Babylon's test and was brought to the courts of the king. He had no blemish, was well favoured, skilful in all wisdom, cunning in knowledge, understood science and had ability in him to stand in the king's palace. *Daniel 1:4.*

2. He purposed in his heart not to defile himself contrary to Jewish custom with the king of Babylon's meat or drink in obedience to the laws of God – Excellence in Spirit

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3. During the reign of Nebuchadnezzar, he ruled over the whole province of Babylon and was chief of the governors over all the wise men of Babylon. He had an independent testimony that light, understanding, wisdom and an excellent spirit was in him. Excellence cannot be hid, if it is truly excellence it can and will be discerned by others and set you apart on a path to greatness.





4. Daniel displayed **Excellence in his work –** Like the holy writ says **– "***Then this Daniel was preferred above the presidents and princes, because an excellent spirit was in him; and the king thought to set him over the whole realm – Daniel 6:3 (KJV)*

Excellence attracts favour but we must be ready for opposition. Be ready to hear the all too familiar Nigerian 'na you only sabi, you too know'. Daniel stood in jeopardy of losing his life because of the conspiracy of his enemies. Enemies who acknowledged that he was faithful, neither was there any error nor fault in him.

5. Excellence endures and brings prosperity – Daniel prospered in the reign of Darius and in the reign of Cyrus who succeeded Darius. He endured through the reign of 4 kings and 2 empires.
