INTERNATIONAL JUNIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION (IJSCE)

In line with our commitment to providing the best in education, Lifeforte School introduced the INTERNATIONAL JUNIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE EXAMINATIONS (IJSCE) for students in Grade 9/JSS3 which is written in conjunction with the Cambridge checkpoint exams.

The exams based on the key stage 3 syllabus (which was introduced over 5 years ago) is aimed at broadening the students' knowledge and sharpening their ability to apply what they are taught to practical real life situations in preparation for the key stage 4 syllabus to be taught at Senior High School. Students will be examined in the following subjects:

Moreover, in a world that is so highly competitive, alongside our strong recommendation, the JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE will help to showcase our children and give them the extra competitive edge they need for admission into top universities.

The best student overall with an A* in at least 10 core subjects (Math, English and Sciences inclusive) and 3 A's will be given a scholarship of 50% OFF TUITION for the entire duration of their senior high school tenure. We operate an inclusive system which combines the Nigerian curriculum and related examination (WASSCE by WAEC) with the foreign curriculum and related examinations (CAMBRIDGE, EDEXCEL) such that the Nigerian curriculum is expanded into a larger one incorporating an international curriculum. We still offer a dual curricula and parents may opt for the WAEC syllabus in Grade 10 if they so desire.

The IJSCE examinations will commence on June 1st 2015 and will be concluded on the 18th June, 2015.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

MORNING ASSEMBLY

This half term, our tradition of offering students an exciting co-educational curriculum has continued to enrich their lives. Our students continue to be instructed that 21st century education encompasses collaborative, communicative and critical thinking skills. Thus, the first half term provided a series of stimulating activities including French Club presentation of poems and songs, Junior Spelling Bee, 'What Do You Know' Quiz, French, Yoruba and Igbo Quiz, Get Your Grammar Right, vibrant News presentation (in English and Yoruba), Impromptu speeches and Public speaking/Etiquette classes. Students will certainly remember, amongst others lessons, to use common words such as 'academic', 'cram' and 'tout' appropriately to mean 'Lecturers' (not academically), 'studying a lot of information close to an examination' (not memorising) and 'someone who acts on another's behalf' (not a thug or motor-park attendant). They are also encouraged to wear their manners at all times as they have a positive impact all around and make people react favourably to them.

WORLD DANCE DAY 2015

In commemorating the World Dance Day 2015, Lifeforte International High School joined the rest of the world in celebrating the beauty and relevance of Dance. This year's celebration was our maiden event and four grades took part in the event celebrating four popular African dances: **Zulu Dance** from South Africa (Grade 7), **Akoto Dance** from Republic of Benin and Nigeria (Grade 8), **Bata Dance** from Nigeria (Grade 10) and **Agbeko Dance** from Ghana (Grade 11). PAYMENT OF BILLS


