ENTRANCE AND TRANSFER EXAMINATIONS 2014

The Lifeforte High School entrance and transfer examinations towards the 2014/2015 academic session was held on the 25th of January, 2014 at 4 centres across the country – Abuja, Lagos, Port-Harcourt and Ibadan. EXTENSION PROGRAMME
