CAMBRIDGE EXAMINATION FEES

Registration for the Oct/Nov Cambridge Ordinary Level examination is in progress. Parents of Grade 12 students should please note that the cost of 7 subjects is N77, 500.00, 8 subjects cost N86, 500.00 and 9 subjects cost N95, 500.00.

Payment should be made by bank draft and sent to the school or Lagos liaison office within the next 2 weeks to meet the registration deadlines.

SELECTION OF SUBJECTS FOR GRADE 9 AND 10

Incoming Grades 9 and 10

Parents of incoming Grade 9 and 10 students are encouraged to discuss subjects' choice with their children bearing in mind their interests and potentials. However, subject selection for Grade 10 is done on entry in accordance with the students' performance in the Cambridge Checkpoint and/or JSCE respectively. The school offers a crucial advisory role in this regard on resumption.

THE MENTORING PROGRAMME

The second half of term witnessed a particularly comprehensive subject by subject revision through the use of 'take-home' drills in preparation for the Promotion examinations. This exercise not only encouraged students to read but also afforded them the opportunity to assess their degree of mastery in different subjects outside exam conditions. It was followed by interactive sessions where corrections were made and clarification provided and students were very grateful for the novel assistance in their hour of need.
