Morning Assembly Programmes

Morning Quiz

In the second half term, our weekly assembly quiz programme continued to witness enthusiastic participation from students across all the houses. The highlight was a special Examination Edition designed to teach students how to provide appropriate answers to questions by identifying key words in the questions asked. Some examples of these are; *identify, explain, state, evaluate, list and describe.*

Get Your Grammar Right

Human interaction is mainly word based and manner of speech defines and identifies the individual. It may register a person as cultured or set them back as uneducated, poorly educated or even slovenly. Here in LifeForte our aim is to mould our students into global citizens and an important aspect of this is the correct usage of language. On 'Get Your Grammar Right' this half term, the English tutors focused on some very technical grammatical situations in the English language. Some examples follow:

1. *Beatify* – exists as a word separate from beautify
2. The expression '*honey I am with the car key*' is defective and unacceptable. The proper expression is '*honey, the car key is with me*'
3. *Outright* – *Ly* should never be added to *outright*
4. *Stinking* – As a natural adverb, should not carry the inflection *Ly*.

The *Get Your Grammar Right* exam edition drew the attention of the students to the need to present their summary and comprehension answers in complete sentences and avoid sentence fragments.

Emphasis was also laid on the one-paragraph, one point theory as the overriding standard of thought organisation in essay writing.

International Day

This much anticipated cross-national competition between the grades took place on the last day of term featuring **Ghana** (grade 7), **Malaysia** (grade 8), **Russia** (grade 9), **Spain** (Grade 10), **Saudi Arabia** (grade 11) and **South Africa** (grade 12). After an educative and exciting quiz competition assessing familiarity with facts about the nations in the morning, the various classes ensured nothing was left to chance as they finalised details about costume, food, language, history and culture including a PowerPoint timeline presentation of the countries to showcase their collective creativity, flair and skill. Malaysian costume was most attractive, the South African timeline most impressive while Ghana's ashanti presentation made an indelible impression especially with the 'azoto' dance. In a keenly contested race, Ghana edged out South Africa as overall winners with Russia in third place. We say well done

to everyone, a huge thank you to our distinguished panel of judges for their love and hearty congratulations to Grade 7 for their first-ever win in this competition! Truly, our odds are being reversed.

Mentoring Department

The creation of the weekly ‘mentoring period’ between mentors and protégés has improved frequency of mentoring interactions this term. Protégé’s are becoming more optimistic about assistance and cooperate readily with assistance provided.

General practical assistance was made available to the student body through detailed study/answering skills session aimed at teaching methods of identifying and summarising key facts. Daily grade-specific revision tutorials also took place in the auditorium as subject teachers took the opportunity to tackle specific challenging topics in respective subjects apart from revising their subjects generally.

Another beneficial innovation this term was the peer-group mentoring assistance organised in the hostels where support and assistance between relatively strong and challenged students was facilitated in a carefully supervised manner. We are optimistic that this will close the gap between high achieving and improving students in study habits and learning interest thereby creating a unique learning environment where each individual remains teachable as they grow to maximise their own potential.
