## **INTERNATIONAL JUNIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION (IJSCE)**

In line with our commitment to providing the best in education, Lifeforte School introduced the INTERNATIONAL JUNIOR SECONDARY CERTIFICATE EXAMINATIONS (IJSCE) for students in Grade 9/JSS3 which is written in conjunction with the Cambridge checkpoint exams.

The exams based on the key stage 3 syllabus (which was introduced over 4 years ago) is aimed at broadening the students' knowledge and sharpening their ability to apply what they are taught to practical real life situations in preparation for the key stage 4 syllabus to be taught at Senior High School. Students will be examined in the following subjects:

Moreover, in a world that is so highly competitive, alongside the good recommendation, the JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL CERTIFICATE will help to showcase and give our children the extra competitive edge they need for admission into top universities.

We still offer a dual curricula and parents may opt for the WAEC syllabus in Grade 10 if they so desire.

The IJSCE examinations will commence on the 9th of June 2014 and will be concluded on the 19<sup>th</sup> June, 2014.

## **MENTORING DEPARTMENT**

Recognizing early preparation to be a key ingredient for excellent success, the mentoring team has prepared a structured format for students in grades 7, 8, 10 and 11 that enables them to read systematically (study time-table) and cover sufficient number of pages (or topics) during each reading session. In addition to helping students prepare for the promotion examinations in good time, it assists mentors and teachers to monitor how much ground is being covered by a student and determine if more reading time is required to ensure completion of the syllabus before the revision week. We would like our parents to know that this schedule of topics (for the 2013/2014 session) has been affixed to their reading jotters and hope it can be useful as they do some light reading over the short holiday. We appreciate your support always.

### **MORNING ASSEMBLY**


### **GENERAL**
