The inaugural meeting of the Lifeforte Advisory Council was held in school on Monday 18th June, 2012. Convened at the behest of Her Excellency, the First Lady of Ondo State Mrs. Olukemi Mimiko, the meeting was well attended. It was a highly successful meeting at which meaningful deliberations were had and highly useful suggestions made which are already being implemented.

VALEDICTORY SERVICE PROGRAMME

The 2012 Valedictory Service in honour of the outgoing O and A level students was held on the 16th of June at the JBJ auditorium. It was a grand affair as parents, friends, well-wishers, staff and students of the school rejoiced with the graduands. Adding to the honour of the day was HRH Kabiyesi K.A.O. Sansi who was in attendance to witness the graduation of his grandson from the maiden Early decision A' level class – Joshua-Olubi Johnson, the CEO's last child.

The Special guest of honour Mr. Seyi Obakin delivered the commendation speech. Mr. Obakin, the CEO of a leading charity organisation in the United Kingdom, urged the students to look beyond the immediate goal of their career to become leaders by developing the virtues of being positive always, taking responsibility, being humble (losing your pride but maintaining your dignity) and being compassionate (a blend of fairness, kindness and courage). OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2012 CAMBRIDGE EXAMINATION FEES

This is to inform parents of all Grade 11 students (going into Grade 12) that registration for the Oct/Nov GCE O' level examination has begun and is open to **ALL** students who successfully cross into Grade 12 (2012/2013). This includes students who may have already written the exams earlier in May/June this year. The current cost of registration is as follows:

O/level 7 (seven) subjects - N115, 800.00 8 (eight) subjects - N129, 300.00 9 (nine) subjects - N142, 800.00 AS 3 subjects - N76, 800.00 4 subjects - N95, 300.00 Payment should be made by Draft and sent to the school or Liaison Office on or before Friday 3rd August, 2012.

SELECTION OF SUBJECTS FOR GRADES 9 AND 10

i. Incoming Grade 9

Parents of incoming Grade 9 students are encouraged to discuss subject choices with their children bearing in mind their interests and potentials. The enclosed form should be filled and submitted upon resumption.

ii. Incoming Grade 10

Subject selection for Grade 10 is done on resumption in September in accordance with the student's performance in the external examinations written in grade 9. The curriculum/subject selection forms have been sent via e-mail to parents concerned.
