INTER-HOUSE ATHLETICS COMPETITION

The annual Lifeforte International High School Inter House Sports Competition was held on 20th January 2018 at the school’s ultra-modern Sports Complex. The colourful event, which had in attendance parents, students, members of staff and guests athletes from invited schools, was fun and highly stimulating. Events featured a march past, riveting callisthenic display, a novelty match (involving teachers and our dads), a 50m race by courageous mums and various sprint events. Field events and longer distance races had been settled during heats prior to D-day.

At the end of several keen contests on the track, amidst cheers and standing ovations, Ruth House clinched overall first place with 20 gold, 8 silver and 10 bronze medals! We encourage parents to pay all outstanding bills on or before resumption from the half-term (17th February, 2018)


GENERAL
