### FROM: CURRICULUM & STUDIES DEPARTMENT

#### SELECTION OF SUBJECTS FOR GRADES 9 AND 10

1. Incoming Grade 9

Parents of incoming Grade 9 students are encouraged to discuss subject choices with their children bearing in mind their interests, capability and potential. Forms will be sent by e-mail for this purpose and should be completed before resumption.

2. Incoming Grade 10

Subject selection for Grade 10 is done on resumption in September in accordance with the student's performance in the external examinations written in Grade 9. The curriculum/subject selection forms will be sent via e-mail.

#### OCTOBER/NOVEMBER 2018 CAMBRIGE EXAMINATION FEES

This is to inform parent of grade 11 students (progressing to grade 12) that registration for the Oct/ Nov examination has commenced. Registration forms were given to students over the mid-term break to take home and discuss with parents. These were returned and processed and emails sent to all parents communicating the registration details and exam fees payable. This exam is a trial run for official use only.

Consequently, results of this exam will not be released until students graduate in 2020. The dead line for payment of exam fee is 26th July 2019. Statement of results/ certificates will be available for collection at graduation.
