ACADEMICS

RESUMPTION

Students are expected back from this half term holiday on Saturday, 19thFebruary, 2022. The rail transport facility from Lagos will be available and parents can take advantage of this for their convenience. We appeal to our parents to support us in reinforcing a culture of punctuality and obedience by ensuring that their children/wards return to school on the specified day. As academic work normally resumes immediately, delays will not be in the student's best interest.

EXTENSION PROGRAMME

The extension programme for students in Grades 9, 11, 12 and A levels will begin on Tuesday, 4thApril, 2022. The aim of this programme is to give teachers adequate time to prepare students for their imminent external examinations. We strongly encourage parents of students in the classes involved to work with us to ensure that the students get the most out of this time. We will inform you in due course regarding the protocol for the Easter weekend. Please note that NO EXEATS will be issued for the purposes of the Easter or other holidays. Students are expected to remain in school for this period. Food items, money, mobile phones, electrical appliances, technological or digital devices of any sort are not permitted.

MENTORING AND CHILD SUPPORT
